I play this tune with a medium strength dotted half speed delay on both the melody and the bass. Assuming that the tune is played at 152bpm per quarter note as suggested, I would have a delay on both sides with a speed of 600ms, the wet level set at about 35%, and a feedback setting of around 20. It's absolutely critical to keep good time though in order to keep the rhythm clear.
